

HAZARDS, RESILIENCE, & HUMAN SECURITY EMPHASIS

This emphasis focuses on human security from natural and anthropogenic hazards and building resiliencies on local, regional and global scales. Students can choose electives that allow them to specialize in either hazards, environmental management or policy areas.

There are many uncertainties in the world today that put populations at risk including climate change, wildfires, earthquakes, global terrorism, pollution and contagious disease. The courses in this emphasis cover topics of natural hazards, health and disease, terrorism, crime and climate change. Upon completion, students will have knowledge of many hazards and human vulnerabilities, as well as related policies and resiliencies constructed to increase human security.
